The Cosmic Christ (Colossians 1:15-20) Readers' Theater

I've found that Readers' Theater is an effective way to present a passage of Scripture, highlighting its various dimensions through multiple voices. Colossians 1:15–20 is jam-packed with Christology. While I could unpack it through a sermon, I chose instead to explore it through choral reading—a method I refer to as Readers' Theater.

You'll notice repetition, synonymous phrasing, explanatory sentences, and occasional unison to emphasize key truths. This presentation is based on the New Living Translation (NLT) of Colossians 1:15–20, spoken by Reader 1 and expanded upon by Readers 2 and 3. You'll also hear echoes of John 1:1 and Isaiah 53:5–6.

I always prepare a separate script for each reader, highlighting their lines with a yellow marker for easy reference. If you choose to use this approach, be sure to rehearse at least three times with your readers to avoid awkward pauses between lines. The reading is designed to move quickly, building momentum for a cumulative impact.

READER 3	Christ holds the universe together by his power.
READER 1	Christ is also the head of the church which is his body.
READER 2	The Church, God's people around the world
READER 3	Christ is head
READER 2	He is large and in charge.
READER 1	He is the beginning, the first one to rise from the dead
READER 2	But not the last one.
READER 3	He is supreme over all who rise from the dead.
READER 1	So he is first in everything.
READER 2	Yes, first.
READER 3	Primo.
READER 2	Number one.
READER 3	Jesus
READER 2	Jesus Christ
READER 3	Our Lord
ALL	IS SUPREME OVER ALL!
READER 1	For God in all his fullness was pleased to live in Christ,

READER 2	The fullness of God
READER 3	All there is of God
READER 2	Was packed into the Man Christ Jesus
READER 3	Fully man, fully God
READER 2	Compressed into human flesh
READER 1	And through him
READER 2	Through Christ
READER 1	God reconciled everything to himself.
READER 2	Reconciled
READER 3	Everything
READER 2	All that was at war with God Christ reconciled
READER 3	Brought together
READER 2	Made one in him
READER 3	Our warring hearts were healed.
READER 1	He made peace with everything in heaven and on earth by means of Christ's blood on the cross.
READER 2	He was pierced for our transgressions,
READER 3	He was crushed for our iniquities;
READER 2	The punishment that brought us peace was upon him,
READER 3	and by his wounds we are healed.
READER 2	All we like sheep had gone astray, but he searched for us and brought us home.
READER 1	Christ our Savior
READER 2	Christ the image of the invisible God
READER 3	Christ who is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End
READER 2	Has come to bring us home
READER 3	Home
ALL (quietly)	HOME AT LAST
