

Appendix 2 - Chronology of the Post-Exilic Period

559 to 530 BC Cyrus the Great reigns, founds the Medo-Persian Empire.	
539	Babylon falls to the Persians.
538	Cyrus allows the first wave of Jews to return to Jerusalem (Ezra 1:1-4).
537-520	Temple rebuilt in Jerusalem (Ezra 5:1; Haggai 2:18).
530-522	Cambyses, king of Persia (alluded to in Daniel 11:12).
520s to 518	Haggai's prophecy (to 520 BC), Zechariah's prophecy 520-518 BC)
521-486	Darius I Hystaspes, king of Persia (Ezra 5:5).
486-465	Xerxes I (King Ahasuerus; Ezra 4:6). His second queen was Esther.
464-424	Artaxerxes I Longimanus
458	Ezra receives authorized by Artaxerxes to rebuild the Temple (Ezra 7)
445	Nehemiah goes to Jerusalem to repair its walls (Nehemiah).
424-405	Darius II, king of Persia.
404-359	Artaxerxes II, king of Persia
338-336	Arses, king of Persia
336-331	Darius III, king of Persia
334-323	Alexander the Great conquers Persia, begins Greek Empire (Daniel 8:5, 21)
